


# ANNUAL SHAKESPEARE COMPETITION Monday, February 24 at Orlando Shakes!



Join us at our change in venue for this year's annual *English-Speaking Union's* Shakespeare Competition. This year the action takes to the stage at *Orlando Shakes*, located at **812 East Rollins Street, Orlando, FL 32803**. On Monday, February 24, secure the best seats in the house as doors open early for competitors who must check in by 3:30 p.m. at the latest. Through our ongoing partnership, the Orlando Shakespeare Theater has opened the doors of *The Margeson Theater* so that students can showcase all of their hard work. Proceedings will begin promptly at 4:00 p.m., with refreshments being served at 5:30 p.m., as judges deliberate.

Continuously expanding our outreach, this year's competition includes 20 schools from the tricounty area, with two added schools who have never previously participated in the history of the competition. With fresh talent in a new environment, this year's competition promises to be an exciting event for all. As always, the First Place prize is \$1,000.00 with an all-expense paid trip to New York City for the next round of the national competition held at *The Lincoln Center*. Our First Place winner will also be the recipient of a scholarship to join Orlando Shakes' *The Young Company* during the summer of 2020 (valued at an additional \$250.00). Second Place is \$500.00, and Third Place is \$250.00, all to be awarded before the conclusion of proceedings at the theater. Each competitor, already a winner from his or her school, will perform an individual interpretation of a memorized sonnet and monologue at our February event. Each student's teacher will also be honored with \$250.00 for all of their dedication and hard work.

This year's judging panel consists of Anne Hering: Director of Education at *Orlando Shakes*, Dr. Maurice "Socky" O'Sullivan: E-SU Board Member, author, and Kenneth Curry professor of literature at Rollins College, and David Reed: Assistant Professor of Acting and Directing at UCF. *The English-Speaking Union's National Shakespeare Competition* is a school-based program designed to help high school students develop their speaking and critical thinking skills, as well as their appreciation of literature, as they explore the beauty of the language and the timeless themes in Shake-



speare's works. In the competition, students read, interpret, and perform monologues and sonnets in three qualifying stages—at the school, community, and national levels. Please join us at our Branch Competition and support all of the hard work of our local Shakespeareans.
