Lighthouse Writers Workshop Inside the Writer's Studio





Jeanne Reeves, long-time member of the English-Speaking Union Denver Branch, passed away on July 13, 2019. She was born in St. Joseph, Missouri, on December 22, 1922, daughter of Charles and Florence McFarland. Jeanne graduated from the Colorado Training School for Nurses in Denver in 1945, and she worked at St. Luke's Hospital in Denver.

Jeanne married Roger A. Reeves on March 17, 1945. Roger was a graduate of the School of Engineering at the University of Missouri and was an architect in Denver. He served as ESU Denver Branch President from 1990 to 1995. Roger passed away on April 10, 2006.

Jeanne was active for many years in various organizations, in addition to the English-Speaking Union: Friends of Nursing (past president); Denver Art Museum (docent); and Denver Lyric Opera Guild. She was a member of Saint John's Cathedral and past president of St. Martha's Guild. Jeanne was an avid traveler – she and Roger visited 134 foreign countries.

Jeanne's funeral was held at the Little Ivy Chapel at Fairmount Cemetery on July 21, 2019. She is survived by a daughter, Jennifer Reeves; sons Roger W. 
Join the Denver Branch for a social gathering to view/discuss the Downton Abbey movie
