# Churchill and Spain

Professor Wayne Bowen will examine Winston Churchill's perspective on Spain. This country figured prominently in important events during the leader's life and political experiences,

especially as the complexities of war and diplomacy challenged this view. As the wartime Prime Minister of the U.K., Winston Churchill cautioned the United States about relations with Spain

under General Francisco Franco's government. Wayne Bowen Ph.D. is a professor at the Department of History at the University of Central Florida and the Associate Dean at the UCF College of Undergraduate Studies.



Education Annual Peport 2021-2022

The 2021-22 Education budget granted only two existing education projects and programs from the previous year, The Orlando Shakes summer camps for middle and high school students and the Adult Literacy League. Orlando Shakes was able to return to safe onsite activities for their campers after the totally virtual camps of 2020, while the Literacy League successfully used a hybrid model that will likely remain as a permanent option for their clients. Other grantees who had already received funds from the 2019-2020 budget for their spring 2020 events were notified to continue a rollover of any unused money to apply to their 2021-2022 projects. In that category are: Battle of the Books (Orange and Seminole County Public Schools) and Orange County Public Schools Student Media Festival. Battle of the Books was re-established. One grant, Crealde School of Art: Storytellers Program was not able to complete this project. We have invited them to reapply for next year. We used money from our Contingency Budget to fund two Seminole County teachers to teach a workshop at the International Convention for Teachers of Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL) in Pittsburgh in March. Our most ambitious grant in Branch history was granted to the University of Central Florida College of Education this year. The \$100,000 grant, to commemorate the ESU Centennial, is named in honor of our founding member and benefactress, Jessie Drey. For the next five years, this grant provides \$20,000 in scholarships per year to the university for teaching professionals seeking graduate degrees.

Recent grantees are being offered the opportunity to apply again for the 2022-2023 cycle with a Grant Application/Review form we have designed (required by ESUUS). The Education Committee will review any grant requests received before the June Board Meeting and in time for the final budget approval in September.

Total Budgeted: \$132,410 Total spent: \$126,396
