Dr. Catherine Loomis holds a PhD in Renaissance Literature from the University of Rochester, and an MA in Shakespeare and Performance from the Shakespeare Institute in Stratford-upon-Avon. From 1997 until 2017 she taught Shakespeare and other literature courses at the University of New Orleans, leaving as a tenured full professor. She has also taught at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro and at the Rochester Institute of Technology. Dr. Loomis is the author of William Shakespeare: A Documentary Volume (2002), a collection of the documents we use to construct Shakespeare's biography, and of The Death of Elizabeth I: Remembering and Reconstructing the Virgin Queen (2010), a study of the literary response to the death of Queen Elizabeth I. With Dr. Sid Ray, she is the co-editor of Shaping Shakespeare for Performance: The Bear Stage (2015), a collection of essays on the staging practices used by Shakespeare and his contemporaries. Dr. Loomis has published numerous scholarly essays on Shakespeare and Queen Elizabeth I, and serves as president of the Queen Elizabeth I Society, a group of scholars dedicated to the study of Elizabethan history, art history, and literature.

Guided tour at the National Portrait Gallery of portraits of Shakespeare's queens. Opportunity to see the First Folio at the British Library. An afternoon at Shakespeare's Globe including a matinee performance of Midsummer's Night's Dream and behind-the-scenes tour.

Excursion to Hatfield House, home of Robert Gascoyne-Cecil, 7th Marquess of Salisbury, for a before-hours, guided tour of the House and, hopefully, the Old Palace. Lunch in the country before returning to London. Special evening at Dartmouth House, home of The English-Speaking Union, with a tour of this historic house, reception and farewell dinner.

Optional guided walking tour of the Inns of Court, including references to Shakespeare and the Elizabethan world, followed by lunch in Middle Temple Hall. Transfer to LHR or extend your stay.

Shakespeare was a playwright, an actor and a businessman. His theatre stood among brothels and bear baiting pits, but he performed in front of kings and queens. He lived in London, and in Stratford-upon-Avon, and with his actors he toured around England. This course will take these facets of Shakespeare's life, each imagined as a typical day, and discuss how their influence can be seen in some of his best-known plays.

Seminars meet each weekday morning, with afternoons free for course-related field trips, individual study, or exploring the many places of interest in and around the city.

Immerse yourself in the language and world of Shakespeare with experts from the Shakespeare Birthplace Trust. Based in the historic sites of Harvard House and Hall's Croft, you will enjoy interactive, illustrated talks from eminent scholars on a range of topics including: Shakespeare's Life, Times and Legacy; Shakespeare in Performance; Music in Shakespeare's Theatre; The First Folio in its anniversary year; current research trends in Shakespeare Studies. There will also be an opportunity to learn more about the Trust's treasures held in its archives and collections through a Q&A with its collections' experts. The course will include behind the scenes tours and museum visits as well performances at the world-renowned Royal Shakespeare Company and Globe theatres. [July schedule will be available in February.] To set you up for the theatre visits you will engage in pre-performance talks on the plays being seen, along with facilitated group post-performance discussions and a chance to talk with members of the RSC's acting company.
